



Chartered Institute of Housing Level 2 Award in Involvement in Housing and Communities

Pathway - Resident Scrutiny

This is a new qualification that is suitable for tenants and residents and aims to provide the skills and knowledge to help them be actively involved in their activities with the housing organisation and their communities.

This pathway comprises of five units. The learner must achieve a minimum of 3 units to achieve the award.
